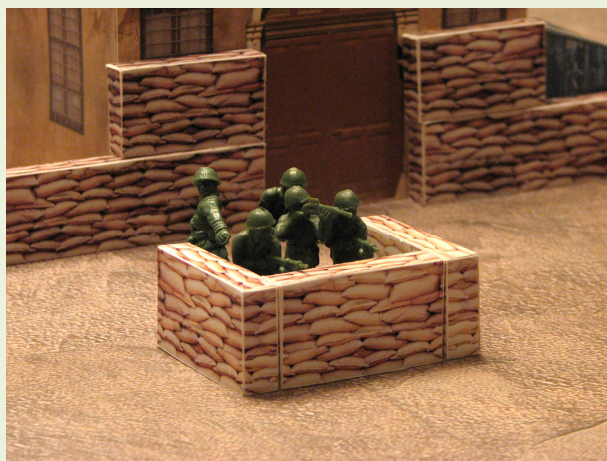
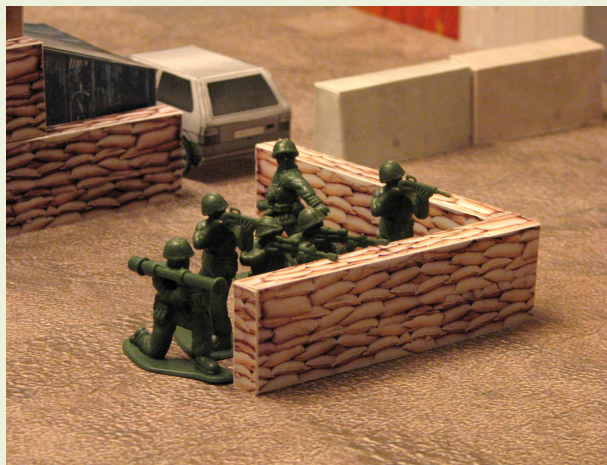
Like many gamers today, we love seeing intricate and elaborate scenery setups on our war-gaming tables. Many hardcore enthusiasts sometimes invest several hundreds of dollars into creating beautiful scenery and terrain but unfortunately not many of us have the means to invest in such extravagant productions. Thankfully, the Combat Storm Team has a low-cost solution that maintains the look and integrity of high-cost models!

In this pack, you'll notice that the sandbags are available in two different flavors: civilian sandbags and military sandbags. The main difference between the two types is the color — the civilian sandbags are a bit cleaner and the military sandbags have a dirtier, grungier look to them.

Sandbags are great terrain pieces to use when setting up a military base, terrorist hideout, or even a simple "checkpoint" area

along a road. And since we're using Papercraft, you can print out as many as you like.

As with all of our downloadable templates, we have created them to be simple, high quality, and fun, allowing you to download, print, assemble and play in a few quick steps!



Materials You Will Need:

Hobby Knife. The hobby knife is used in conjunction with the straight-edge ruler to create a clean edge when cutting. If a hobby knife is not available, scissors can be used.

White Glue. White glue is used to glue the tabs of the cutouts together. A glue-stick can be used as an alternative.

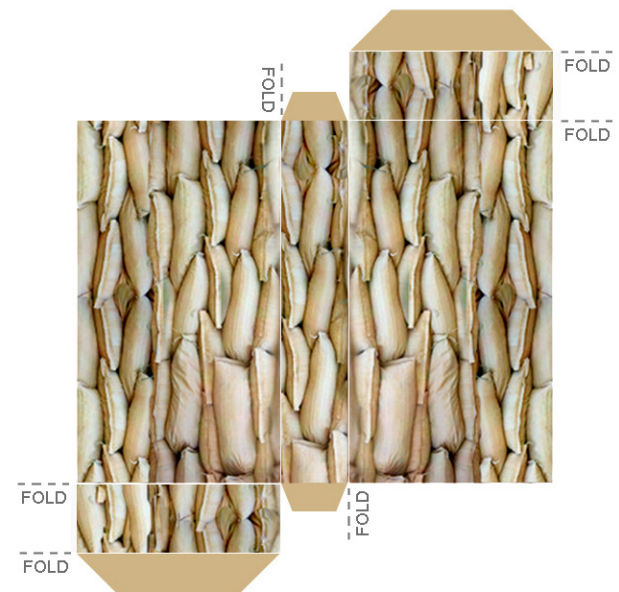
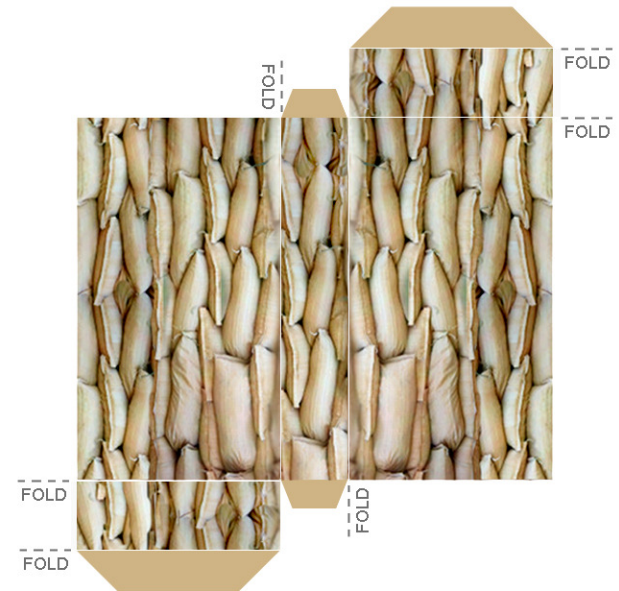
Straight-edge Ruler. The ruler is used with the hobby knife to help act as a guide for your knife when cutting a straight edge.

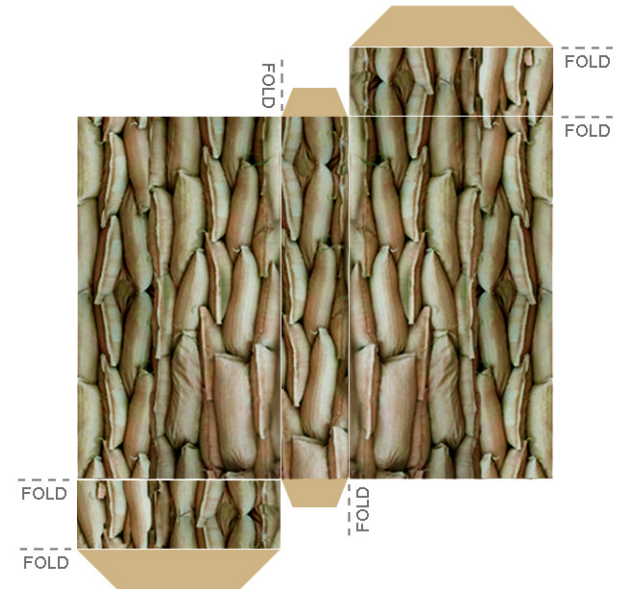
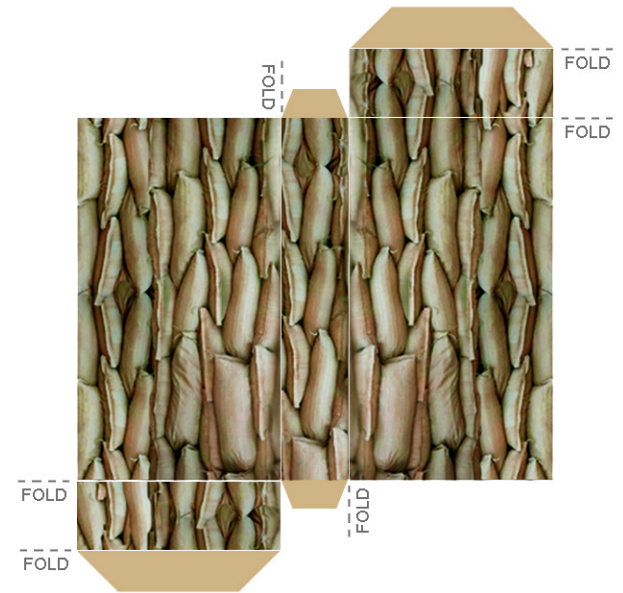
Cutting Board. All cutting with the hobby knife should be done over the cutting board. Cutting boards can be obtained at your local office supply store. A piece of cardboard can be used as an alternative.

Cardstock or Photo Paper. Print templates on cardstock using a color printer. The heavier the weight of the card, the better. Most cardstock is 110LB paper which works well and is inexpensive. Some photo paper is even thicker and offers better image quality. Standard paper is not recommended.

TIP: To add additional weight to your terrain pieces, simply tape a coin or two on the inside wall of the Papercraft.
